Curriculum for Adult Education

An amazing treasure is to find the old Turkish Baths, converted today into a traditional Greek restaurant that have preserved the spirit of the old Ottomans times when the exquisitely beautiful mosaic glass lamps were not just decorating the home but a sign of elitism and success.

The lamps are made with an iron frame, with genuine coloured glass mosaic pieces (no paint!) and the ancient technics of Anadola. The light goes through the colours illuminating in a unique way the space, spreading true magic for the eyes – dancing lights of colour.
